What is Leverage?

Leverage allows traders to control a larger trading position with a smaller amount of capital.

It amplifies both potential profits and potential losses.

□ How does Leverage work?

Leverage is expressed as a ratio, such as **1:100**.

Example:

- With **1:100 leverage**
- You only need **\$1,000 margin**
- To control a **\$100,000 position**

This means your trading power is increased 100 times your deposited margin.

□ Why is Leverage important?

Leverage allows traders to:

- Open larger positions
- Use capital more efficiently

However, it also increases risk.
